Lauren Wright, from Sarasota, Florida has been raising and showing Llamas and Alpacas with her family for 25 years. With 8 years of judging coast to coast and numerous National Championship titles in both Halter and Performance to her name, Lauren is no stranger to the show ring. Along with maintaining a herd of around 30 head, she also works as a nurse for the local regional hospital. She is currently serving on the ALSA BOD, and ILR Halter committee.

Harvey Pool

Abbeville, GA Harvey Pool, from, Abbeville, GA, was raised on a small cattle and swine farm in Tifton, Georgia. He exhibited his first Champion animal, a Jersey Cow, in 1963 at the Tift County Fair at five years of age. The next year his pig was awarded Grand Champion. He has raised and shown all species of livestock and competed in Livestock Judging contests for over 50 years. Harvey graduated from the University of Georgia with degrees in Animal Science (BS), and Agriculture Education (Med, EDS). While attending UGA he participated on the Livestock Judging Team and served as President of the National Junior Polled Hereford Association. Formerly employed as Young Farmer Teacher with Crawford County School System, Harvey taught Animal Science and trained FFA Livestock Judging teams for competition. Harvey was employed in Agricultural Education for 32 years. During this tenure, he has superintended and judged numerous livestock shows across the state of Georgia and currently serves as Superintendent of the North American Llama-Alpaca Show in Louisville, KY. He is an ILR-SD and ALSA Certified llama judge and has previously served on the ILR Board of Directors. Harvey and his wife Lisa own and operate Rock Creek Farm and Llama Co. where they manage and show over 75 llamas. Their initiative began with emphasis on conformation and fleece quality and has now expanded to include packing and carting with these wonderful animals.




