MINNESOTA CENTURY FARM RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Thank you for your interest in the 2025 Minnesota Century Farm recognition program, sponsored jointly by the Minnesota State Fair and the Minnesota Farm Bureau.

Please fill out the application completely; incomplete applications will not be considered. All of the qualifications must be met at the time the application is submitted.

The annual application deadline is the first Monday in March (March 3, 2025), and must be received by the Minnesota State Fair by that date (this is not a postmark deadline). Qualified applications received after March 3 will be considered for 2026.

Qualifications for inclusion are as follows:

- 1. The farm must be at least 100 years old by the end of 2025 according to abstract of title, land patent, original deed, county land records, court file in registration proceedings or other authentic land records.
 - a. The applicant should verify that the farm qualifies as a Century Farm, but we do not require direct proof.
 - b. Please do not send supporting documentation, only the completed application.
- 2. Farm is family-owned for 100 years or more.
 - a. "Family" defined as
 - i. parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, brothers, sisters, sons, daughters, first cousins and direct in-laws (father, mother, brother, sister, daughter, son-in-law).
- 3. Family ownership **must be** continuous.
- 4. Continuous residence on farm is **not** required.
- 5. The farm should consist of 50 or more acres (intrastate Minnesota).
- 6. Farm must be currently involved in agricultural production.
- 7. A farm may be recognized only once.

Qualifying farms will receive:

- 1. One personalized certificate of recognition, signed by the Governor of Minnesota, the President of Minnesota Farm Bureau, and the President of the board of the Minnesota State Fair.
- 2. One weather resistant sign, measuring 6 inches by 17.5 inches, proclaiming the farm is a "Century Farm."





MINNESOTA CENTURY FARM RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Recognition ceremonies are handled by the local county fair where this milestone may be celebrated with friends, family and neighbors. Certificates and signs will be sent to the representative at the county fair responsible for administering the Century Farm Program for the county fair.

If your county fair **does not** have a ceremony, your certificate and sign will be sent directly to you in June. Only one sign and certificate will be awarded per farm.

While the Minnesota State Fair does not conduct a recognition ceremony during the Minnesota State Fair, we encourage those who have been awarded a Century Farm this year to visit the Minnesota Farm Bureau booth where your application may be viewed and you may request a special commemorative Century Farm rosette.

The Century Farm status is only conferred on a farm one time. New owners from the same "family" after a farm has already been designated a Century Farm, may not reapply or request a new certificate.

The Minnesota State Fair and the Minnesota Farm Bureau thank you for your interest in the Century Farm program.

SESQUICENTENNIAL FARM PROGRAM

In addition to the co-sponsoring of the Century Farm Program, the Minnesota Farm Bureau honors Minnesota families who have owned their farms for at least 150 years, are at least 50 acres in size and are currently involved in agricultural production.
